Have You Ever Heard About Mom's In Prayer International?

As we prayed about God's plans for our children in terms of their education more than twenty-five years ago, I perceived the Holy Spirit nudging me toward starting a prayer group for the elementary school located in our neighborhood. I panicked because I did not know what a prayer group would look like at that point, or ways to coordinate one. (How wonderfully the Lord teaches us!) However, I learned through an online source, by God's great grace, about a group called Moms in Touch, which is currently known as Moms in Prayer International.

I spent one year with some great mothers in my neighborhood, praying for the school district which my daughter attended for kindergarten. What is the Lord leading you as parents, to do with your children? Moreover, with whom can you partner in prayer for the school, home education, or college they may be attending this year?

The following is a testimony from Lynette Taylor, Great Lakes Division Coordinator, who directs Moms in Prayer for Illinois, Michigan, Ohio, and Wisconsin.

In 1994 I was a young mother of three boys and pregnant with my fourth, when my mom bought me the Moms in Prayer Booklet. I was in a stage of life where I would have protected my children from everything if I could, but I quickly discovered that was impossible. As I started praying in a Moms in Prayer group, my relationship with the Lord began to take shape. I went from knowing about Him, to really trusting Him, His name, and His character. Praying together with other moms not only taught me how to pray, but how to let go of all I wanted to control and to trust God... His word, His work, His provision, and His plans.

The Pronouncing of Blessings by Elder Jeff Cook

We can bless someone a few different ways. To mention a few, we can pronounce a blessing over them or pray a blessing for them. However, when we pronounce a blessing over someone, we're earnestly asking God to grant them our prayer request.

We're pronouncing or speaking it into the atmosphere, and we're co-signing it in Jesus' name. When we bless someone in Jesus' name, God takes notice. In the Old Testament, Jacob pronounced a blessing on Joseph's boys, Ephraim and Manasseh. Often, a blessing pronouncement is followed by a laying on of hands, as Jacob did to his grandson.

As fathers, we should not only pray a blessing over our children, but we should also pronounce a blessing over our children. We want God to bless them as they go out and come in. We want the favor of God to follow them and go before them wherever they go. We want them to be in good health, be prosperous, love all men, and help those in need. They should be givers, not takers—that they are the lender, not the borrower.

And most of all, we pray their relationship with Jesus Christ is first in their life, and they would love what He loves and hate what He hates. We pronounce their days on this earth will be long, and their lights would shine before men, that they may see their good works and glorify our Father, which is in heaven.

We pray everything they put their hands to in Jesus' name will be given to them for His glory. This is how I pronounce a blessing over my children. Be blessed!
